for our Saviour was born around this time of year. But what is even more important is who that baby was to become, because we do not leave Him in the manger!

I tend to prefer the hymns that say, "Unto us a boy is born... King of all Creation", or "The First Noel... born is the King of Israel", or "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing ... Glory to the new - born King". These hymns take us on a journey into the future - a journey of One who would forever change how we view and understand Jesus Christ, our Lord, Master, and Saviour, and how we understand our special relationship within God's Kingdom. Some years ago, there was a road near where I live with a bend in it. Right near that bend were three trees - a Jacaranda, a Marri gum, and an Australian Christmas bush (Nuytsia floribunda).

I went that way one day, just before Christmas, and they were all in bloom. It was a beautiful sight, and I remember thinking how appropriate it was - the purple/mauve of the Jacaranda, the creamy white of the Marri, and the brilliant yellow of the Christmas bush!These colours seemed fit for a King! They also symbolized Christian themes: purple for Royalty, white for Purity, and gold for precious Gifts, or God's promise of a King born to serve.

He would not be a King of power and might but a Servant King, who would give Himself as a ransom for our sins, our faults, our failings, and our uncertainties. He came to set us free, to encourage our hopes and dreams, to strengthen our faith, and to draw us closer to our amazing Creator God.

So, in this busy pre-Christmas season, let us take time to reflect, not just on a tiny baby, but on a King - in all His Majesty, but also in His humility, His service, His never-ending love and grace... our Immanuel, with us, and our Prince of Peace!

"Glory to God in the highest, and peace on earth to those with whom he is pleased." (Luke 2:14)

# PINJARRA COMMUNITY KITCHEN REPORT TO CHURCH COUNCIL NOVEMBER 2024



My how time flies, it's November already and the first Tuesday of the month saw the Shire of Murray attend the kitchen to deliver the proceeds of their "food drive".

It is always very humbling to see how the local community rallies to this cause, it takes our ladies two or three days to work their way through the goods and sort them out into their respective categories (beans, soup, peas, meat etc) ready for storage.

As usual David Bolt came along and spent a couple of hours talking to our volunteers and customers alike. He was very interested to learn about how the local café assisted by donating their "take away" food every Monday after closing for the day. He saw first hand the amount of donations plus how professionally presented they are, adhering to the 'Health & Safety' regulations.

At this time of year our student's from St Joseph's school become extremely busy preparing for Christmas plus leaving Primary School for High School. To this end they concluded their work at the kitchen on 29<sup>th</sup> October, but return on Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> November when we arrange a Christmas Party for them, in appreciation of their efforts throughout the year.

Once again I am pleased to say the Shire have donated the hall enabling us to provide a lovely Christmas dinner for local battlers. At this point financial support from the Shire is not confirmed but word of mouth tells us it will be coming through. The date for the dinner has been set down for Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> December. Numbers attending continue to fluctuate but are averaging between 30-40 per week, not including the deliveries of 'take away' food.

# Again we give our thanks to our congregation and council for their continued support.

On Tuesday 12th November 2024 we started the 12th year of providing a service to people in need in and around Pinjarra.

It is with sad regret that I inform the congregation that after over 11 years (7 as treasurer) I am tendering my resignation to the kitchen, effective from 7th January 2025.

A special meeting will soon be held by the committee of the PCK to accept my resignation and elect a new Treasurer. The new treasurer will be elected from the existing committee.

what the real meaning of Christmas is. So many Christmas hymns speak of a baby


# THE CHRISTMAS BOWL


