Easy Cabbage Rolls

This easy recipe for cabbage rolls is made in the slow cooker with a sweet and tangy tomato sauce.

Ingredients

- 12 leaves cabbage
- 1 pound extra-lean ground beef
- 1 cup cooked white rice
- 1 egg, beaten
- ¼ cup milk
- ¼ cup minced onion
- 1 ¼ teaspoons salt
- 1 ¼ teaspoons ground black pepper
- 1 (8 ounce) jar tomato passata
- 1 tablespoon brown sugar
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice
 1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce

Directions

- 1. Bring a large pot of water to a boil. Boil cabbage leaves for 2 minutes; drain.
- Combine ground beef, cooked rice, egg, milk, onion, salt, and pepper in a large bowl. Spoon about 2 tablespoons of mixture onto each cabbage leaf.
- 3. Bring one end of the cabbage leaf over the mixture, rolling and tucking in the ends to prevent filling from falling out; arrange rolls in a single layer in the slow cooker.
- 4. Mix tomato passata, brown sugar, lemon juice, and Worcestershire sauce together in a small bowl until combined. Pour over cabbage rolls. Cover and cook on Low for 8 to 9 hours, or on high for 4 to 5 hours.

TRANSCRIPT: Beloved friends in Christ, I greet you from Sydney Town Hall on the lands of the Gadigal People where 48 years ago the Uniting Church in Australia was born. Today, we give thanks for the grace that has carried us and the love of God that continues to weave us together. This year, we mark two milestones. 40 years of the Uniting Aboriginal and Islander Christian Congress, a covenant of truth, justice and deep listening. And 40 years when we declared ourselves a multicultural church. Many bodies, one body united in the Spirit of Christ. I've personally seen the Spirit at work in quiet faithfulness, bold leadership, deep compassion and the perseverance of the faith. But friends, I'm also seeing the cracks and the blind spots of our own brokenness.

MEETING OF PRESBYTERY

MT. PLEASANT UNITING CHURCH SATURDAY 21ST JUNE 2025

Theme: "The still, small voice of God"

Chair of Presbytery Alison Xamon opened the meeting with a welcome and the lighting of the Christ candle.

Rev Robbie Jetta gave the "welcome to Country"

This was followed by a ten minute "Community Building and Prayer together" period in small groups.

Proposal 1: Rev Reuben Edmonds: Meeting arrangements and acceptance of Order of Business. Agreed by consensus.

Reception of reports:

Chairperson: Alison Xamon who spoke to her report by suggesting that those congregations/faith communities that continue to pay their "mission & nurture" are the "Rock" of our church.

Treasurer: Janine Mc Donald **Candidates for Ministry:** Rev Bev Fabb.

All reports were accepted and agreed by consensus.

Proposal 2: Rev Bev Fabb "Recognition of Megan Reynolds as a Lay Preacher. A secret ballot was taken later in the proceeding when it was agreed that Megan be commissioned as a Lay Preacher within the Synod of Western Australia.

A short video from **Uniting World** EOFY appeal was shown.

Cont.....

Rev Ken Summer offered his greetings from National Congress. (UAICC). Ken is a 'First Nations Elder'

Rev Dr Andrew Williams spoke of the proposed changes to the Code of Ethics. The changes relate to retired ministers who, after retirement stay on in the same church as members of the congregation but still hold power. This often creates issues for the incoming minister.

David Beards spoke on the concept of "Embargoed Funds" and the proposed changes to 'Proceeds of sale policy.' There are some congregations who successfully applied for Embargoed funds but after 5 years still have not used them! This money will now be returned to the fund as it is deemed to be inequitable. It all now goes into a 'central fund' so any church may apply. The main purpose of such a grant is that it must "enhance the mission of the congregation."

A Frontier Services presentation was led by Montarna Cohen, Shontell Peawini and Rev David Jackson. During a historical look into the work of Frontier Services we were informed that there are 22 rural areas across Australia. David Jackson here in WA runs "pop up" OP Shop whereby donated goods are driven across the region to assist needy people living in remote areas. In the coming months 23 Baptisms will be celebrated. During a 'mic minute' we were informed that the congregation at Pt Headland have been working every Saturday since February bringing the church building back up to safe use. The church will be officially re-opened on Saturday 28th June.
