#### 5. Test electrical items

If you're donating electrical goods, make sure they work and are safe to use. Many op shops can't repair faulty appliances and can't sell anything that doesn't meet Australian Standards.

#### 6. Check what your local op shop accepts

Not every store accepts every type of donation. For example, only some of our larger stores can accept furniture. Most charity shops do not take baby car seats, helmets, old electrical items that do not meet current standards, or company uniforms. If you are not sure, check your local shop's guidelines before you donate.

#### 7. Don't leave items outside

Leaving donations outside after hours might seem convenient but it can leave them damaged or stolen. Please bring your donations during opening hours so we can take care of them properly.

#### 8. Pack your donations like you still care about them

We know it can be tempting to scoop everything into a big bag and drop it off. But the better your donations arrive, the better they look on our shelves. Clothes that are folded, books that are stacked and breakables that are wrapped are easier to sort and quicker to sell.

#### 9. Remove personal information

Please double-check your bags and boxes before donating to make sure you have not left anything personal behind. Diaries, notebooks, wallets and even photo albums can sometimes slip in by mistake. Keep your private details safe at home.

#### 10. Remember the bigger picture

Your donations help stock our stores with affordable goods for people who need them and for those who choose second-hand as a more sustainable option. Every good quality item we can sell helps create jobs, keep goods in use and conserve resources.

By taking a little time to prepare your donations, you can make a big difference. Every good-quality item you give helps your local op shop do more for the community. Thank You:)

# PROPERTY REPORT JULY 2025

On Friday 4<sup>th</sup> July 2025 a representative from the Environmental Services (Asbestos service Register) attended our church to carry out an annual inspection.

The inspection took approximately one hour after which a number of photographs were taken in and around the buildings. A copy of the report plus all photographs will be sent to us in due course.

The only recommendation at the time was to suggest we paint the asbestos cover on the inside of the power box with enamel paint. This is merely to protect people from exposure from loose fibers.

A copy of the last report has been placed in the Property Maintenance Book.

Whilst the inspection was taking place, I managed to take down the fire alarm from the ceiling in the chapel and replace the battery.

#### 10 Tips for donating to an Op Shop

Donating to op shops does more than clear out your cupboards. Your donations stock our stores with affordable, good quality items for people who need them and for people who choose to shop more consciously. They also keep goods in use for longer and save valuable resources by reducing the need for new production. Not everything we receive can be sold. Items that are poor quality, incomplete or left outside often end up in landfill and create extra work for our team.

# These 10 simple tips will help make sure your donations have the greatest impact.

#### 1. Choose quality items

When you donate items in good condition, more people see second-hand shopping as a positive choice. That helps keep more goods in use, reduces demand for new production and supports more jobs for people with disability.

#### 2. Wash clothes before donating

Clean clothes are more likely to sell. Most op shops do not have facilities to wash garments, so unwashed clothing often ends up unsold

#### 3. Check for missing parts

Before you donate, take a quick moment to check board games, puzzles, electronics and appliances. Items with missing parts are difficult to sell and often go to landfill. A simple check can make all the difference.

#### 4. Donate seasonally

Op shops have limited space, so it helps to donate in-season goods. Winter coats sell better in winter and summer dresses sell better in summer. Donating seasonally helps us get your items onto the shop floor quickly so customers can find what they need right now cont......
