

Easy Cheese Scones Recipe

2 C SR Flour of your choice

¼ teaspoon salt

½ teaspoon mustard powder

½ teaspoon paprika

½ cup grated cheddar tasty cheese

3 tablespoons oil

½ cup milk

½ cup water



Learning Partner Gathering

Tuesday 2nd September 2025 (via zoom)

During the Presbytery meeting in June, CEDAL (Committee for Education, Discipleship and Leadership) expressed the notion of every church congregation having one of their member's to become what they referred to as a "Learning Partner." This person would then become the link between CEDAL and congregations, attempting to ensure that communication between the two parties could be improved.

Whilst at the presbytery meeting I phoned our team leader Arthur to explain the request and the possibility of myself being the Learning Partner for Pinjarra. So here I am!

There are over 20 learning partners across the state and we held our first gathering on the above date, not all 20 representatives were present at that time. However, the meeting was recorded so the others could be involved and included with our discussions.

Rev Dr Cathy Lambert chaired the meeting and began by explaining the new name for education within the WA Synod is: Uniting Centre for Education and Formation (UCEF) and this is a part of CEDAL. Also that due to a severe lack of resources they simply could not do everything themselves such as creating resources but we could tap into and use resources from the eastern states and beyond.

Formation is for everyone in the church not simply for those working towards ordination, resources are available to everyone. We can all join/share an event, which is hoped will change the learning culture and keep learning no matter the extent of your personal growth; Keep learning and growing.
