

Cold Christmas Pudding







Ingredients

- 2 cups milk
- 2 heaped tablespoons cocoa
- ½ cup sugar
- 2 level tablespoons gelatine dissolved in ½ cup water
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 15ozs can crushed pineapple, drained
- I/2 cup chopped dates
- ½ cup chopped raisins
- ½ cup sultanas
- ½ cup chopped almonds
- ½ cup chopped cherries

Method

Place milk, cocoa, sugar and dissolved gelatine in a saucepan and heat over a low heat until the sugar and gelatine are well blended in DO NOT BOIL

Mix in the rest of the ingredients and place in a prepared mould and refrigerate till set preferably overnight. (a pudding basin gives a good shape)

Turn out and decorate with glace cherries and a sprig of holly. Serve with whipped cream. Serves 8.

Treasurer Janine Mc Donald presented the 2026 budget for approval. Presbytery budget is in the red by some \$245k due to a "one off" drop in grants coming to Presbytery for Synod. This helped Synod balance their budget in 2025/6 enabling them to restore their grant to Presbytery in 2026.

In HIS Service Trever Thomas

Distribution of ballot papers for the election on to the PRC and the PPC. Trevor Thomas was elected back onto the PPC.

Rev Dr Cathie Lambert announced the completion of this phase three commitments for Rev Mitchell Garlett. Mitch was unable to attend due to other commitments. Phase three allows for additional support for new ministers who are in the first three years of their first ever placement after being ordained into ministry.

Yvonne Robinson presented an update on the Strategic Priorities report. Yvonne spoke of the four major priorities of the committee which are:

Strengthening congregations

Looking to get to know congregations better

Engage with congregations in fresh ways

Identify and resource those congregations that have the potential to engage in effective ministry and mission.

Round table discussions on the on-going work of Presbytery towards the strategic priorities. A questionnaire was completed and returned to Rev Ana Lea'aetoa for CEDAL to assess.

Kane Blackman CEO of Good Sammy gave a presentation on the work of Good Sammy.

Lisa spoke about reflecting on and improving practices. Taking a moment to look at what is working well, what isn't and how can that be improved on. We can't always fix other people's problems but we can be present, mindful and let the child/ren, parents or teachers feel heard, feel valued and create a safe space for them to feel accepted. This is important as we all need a space we can go to where we are accepted for being ourselves.

A few chaplains mentioned how they help children through running of breakfast club programs. More children than we think go to school without breakfast, but a safe space free of judgement is created where they can come and fill their bellies and have the best start to their day of learning. We are very grateful this year for the partnership of the Bendigo Bank that has provided funding and encouraged us to apply for funding for next year.

Neil gave a message on Psalm 1:1-3.
